 Call the Meeting to Order, Roll Call: The Meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. Village of Cambridge: Trustees Franklin, Wittwer, Galler, Kumbier, Schaefer Weiss and President McNally. Excused: Trustee Rose.

Oakland: Supervisors Graffin, Jensen, Vratny and Chair Kapsner. Excused: Supervisor DeGidio

Others present: Lisa Moen, Administrator/Clerk, Village of Cambridge; Kris Breunig, Public Works Director, Village of Cambridge; Susan Dascenzo, Clerk/Treasurer, Oakland; Dannielle Wilken, Deputy Clerk/Treasurer, Oakland; Joe DeYoung, MSA; Tristan and Lynnae McGough; Tara Vasby; Heidi Elliot; Roxy Engelstad.

- 2. **Proof of Posting:** The Agenda was posted in the upper and lower levels of the Amundson Community Center, Cambridge Post Office, Hometown Bank, Oakland Town Hall and the Village Web Site.
- 3. **Appoint a Chairperson for the meeting**: Galler made a motion, seconded by Wittwer that Mark McNally Chair the meeting. Motion carried.
- 4. **Approval of Minutes from July 31, 2019**: Kapsner made a motion to approve the minutes, seconded by Wittwer, motion carried with Kumbier abstaining.
- 5. Discussion and possible action regarding Blue Jay Way: LRIP Grant: Joe DeYoung provided background on the LRIP program. There is over a million dollars set aside for road projects. There are discretionary funds as well as supplemental funds. Grants can be 90% funded, 10% copay down to 50/50. There are no guarantees, however you would have a higher ranking with both municipalities working together on a project: one where they both agree the road is bad, safety issues as it is in front of a school. There would need to be a joint agreement between the municipalities. There would be 5 years to spend the money. Towns have more money; Jefferson County is less competitive than Dane County. Jefferson County has a ranking system that they then forward to the state. Jefferson County is due November 14, Dane County November 8. Discussion of if the Village could even apply as the road is not within the Village Limits. It would need to include a street that is in the Village and expand onto Blue Jay Way. Grant cycle is every 2 years, with 5 years to complete a project. Kapsner noted that Oakland has a grant application almost ready to submit. Vratny added that they have a long-term plan for roads and Blue Jay Way is not on that list. McNally suggested putting a group together to discuss this. Director Breunig commented that it is important to find a short-term solution for safety reasons,

and then examine long term solutions. Vratny commented that Oakland depends on Village businesses, and village businesses depend on Oakland residents. Vratny made a motion to create a work group to work through this, look at short term and then long-term solutions. Two people from each municipality, bring in public works if needed. Target date of next LRIP cycle. Seconded by Schaefer Weiss. Motion failed on a 5-5 vote. (Noes: Franklin, Wittwer, Galler, Kumbier and Schaefer Weiss)

Brief discussion of the current Intergovernmental Agreement and whose responsibility it is to maintain the road, annexation of the roads. Franklin questioned if we championed it, would Oakland work with us? Can we get authority from the state to apply?

Discussion of if we did a short-term repair now, would the road be eligible in a few years?

Witter made a motion to create a work group to work through this, look at short term and then long-term solutions. Two people from each municipality. Goal of short-term solution, schedule/timing/type of repair. Long term goal for the LRIP program 4 years from now., seconded by Schaefer Weiss. Motion carried 9-1 with Galler voting in the negative. Each respective Board will appoint members to the working group at their next meetings.

- 6. Solar Projects: Invenergy is looking outside the Village limits to the west and north. Oakland has a project going in within their boundaries that expands into the Town of Jefferson. They had a few people objecting for aesthetic reasons, but no other objections. It was questioned if the Fire Commission should be looking into what these may entail for them. Oakland's does not have a battery storage facility.
- 7. Potential Growth: Oakland has a new project being proposed on the corner of Hwys A and 18. 60 acres. A large portion is wetland and turned into natural resource areas. The Developers agreement includes senior housing, multi family, single family different styles/types. They have confirmed sewer capacity with COWC. They will have wells.
- 8. Cable Commission: Gary Zibell will be retiring from his full-time job January 1, 2022. He is looking at getting the commission back up and running. They have \$77,000 to spend on updating equipment. Lake Mills recently did an upgrade, which he went and toured. Question if Steve Armstrong is the member at large. Moen and Dascenzo will work on getting this together.
- 9. **Adjournment:** Kumbier made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Franklin. McNally adjourned the meeting at 7:58 p.m. Town of Oakland will host the next meeting.

#### Danny,

At its meeting last week the Village Board considered the October 14, 2021 letter from Michael Reiber offering to grant a revocable license to construct the bike path in exchange for certain agreements from the Village. I will briefly share the Village's perspective on the items Mr. Reiber asked the Village to agree to. The Village is open to working with your clients on the matters they presented, but cannot agree to the terms as written. The Village is also unwilling to tie the bike path to those other issues. Here is further information about the Village's response to each of the items your client requested in the letter:

- 1) Village to issue a fence permit. The Village cannot legally, by contract, bind itself to issue a fence permit. The Board is supportive of the fence. Your client is invited to apply for a permit through the building inspector, who will ultimately be responsible to process the application and decide whether the permit may be issued. There is a process that must be followed to obtain a permit, and the board cannot circumvent that process.
- 2) Prepare a revised CSM. The Village believes that the property owners should take the lead on this. We don't think the Village can or should assume responsibility for preparing a CSM or seeking approval of a CSM for lands not owned by the Village. The Village also is not in the best position to make decisions about how a revised CSM should differ from what is already of record.
- 3) Commence work on Lagoon Rad and STH 134, etc. The Village, working with its engineer, is working on these issues, but cannot agree to the terms in the letter, including the requirement to commence work by December 31, 2022. There are too many variable outside the Village's control.
- 4) Implement the water monitoring plan. The Village is implementing the plan, but cannot agree to the terms in the letter. The Village's public works director is responsible for implementing the plan, and will continue to provide public updates at the Water and Sewer Committee meetings.

The Village will continue to seek resolution of all outstanding issues impacting the Village, your client and others. The Village Board hopes to continue a dialogue with your client regarding these matters, and is open to meet again, if your client would like.

Dear Mr. Somerfield and Mr. Flottmeyer:

At it's October 11, 2021, Plan Commission meeting and October 12, 2021, Village Board meeting, the respective bodies were unanimously in agreement with the placement of traffic signals rather than a roundabout at the corner of Hwy 12/18 and Hwy 134.

The main impetus for this decision was the fact that installing a traffic signal would be much less intrusive for the community as a whole, as well as taking less time to construct. When Highway 12 was shut down and reconstructed a number of years back, there were very negative effects on our businesses and community as a whole. None of the Commissioners or Trustees wanted to put our businesses and citizens in that situation again. This is especially true after the difficulties many businesses have faced during the pandemic, we don't want to place more obstacles in their way.

In addition, as this is the only construction proposed at this time in that area, it was felt that it would be much more efficient to place signals there now, and expand the intersection at a later date, if and when it would be needed. Reconstruction of an intersection, or possible addition of a roundabout later, would be much less intrusive and less expensive than a significant reconstruction of a roundabout or adding additional roundabouts in the future.
